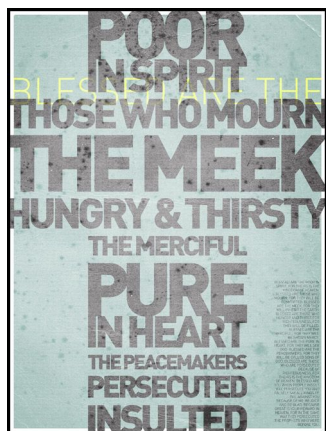

Congratulations to Louis Hanzlik

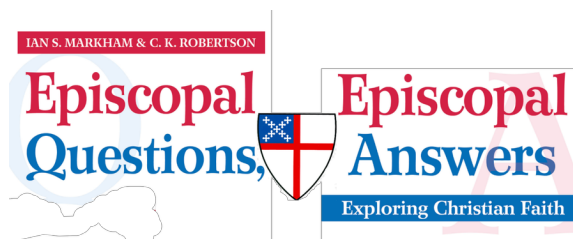

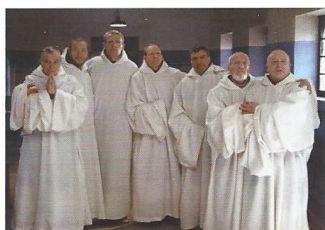
