Our understanding of Bach's greatness leads us to forget the humble offering of his genius to the glory of God without exception throughout his life. In this most captivating of chorale preludes, Bach purposefully presents the chorale tune in canon, riddled with errors, accompanied by an ungainly bass. The alto's virtuosic perpetual motion clashes with the canon, creating a prideful display of chaos and futility. Without God's help our song will never achieve perfection.

The Lessons

Numbers 21:4-9

And the Lord said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; and everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

Bach's repetition of a leaping motive in the pedal is energetic and joyous. Attaching meaning to a musical motive such as this adds an element of subjective interpretation to Bach's work on which we might disagree. Nonetheless, we are grateful that Bach is giving us a moment during Lent to reflect on the gratitude expressed in the chorale.
