## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

THE FIRST LESSON A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Acts 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs-- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.

Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy.

And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist.

The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.

Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.' ".

Reader: The Word of the Lord. **People: Thanks be to God.** 

In our new customary, the Subdeacon introduces the Responsory by simply reading the first line, up to the asterisk; thereafter the People read in unison.

I will sing to the Lord as long as I live; \* I will praise my God while I

have my being.

May these words of mine please him; \* I will rejoice in the Lord.

Bless the Lord, O my soul. \* Hallelujah!

THE SECOND LESSON A Reading from Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians 1 Corinthians :12:3b-13

O one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses. For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body-Jews or Greeks, slaves or free-- and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

THE HOLY GOSPEL John 20:19-23

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. **People: And with thy Spirit.**Gospeler: The Holy Gospel \* of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

People: Glory be to thee, O Lord.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy

Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

THE NICENE CREED

#### A LITANY FOR THE RENEWAL OF OUR VOCATIONS AS CHRISTIANS

Subdeacon: On this Pentecost Sunday we offer ourselves again for the service of Almighty God, according to the gifts he has given each of us.

Leader: Isaiah assures us that God knows us:

## People: "I have called you by name, you are mine." (Isa 43:1)

Leader: Jesus' parable of the talents (Matthew 25:14-29) gives us a clear picture that the gifts we have been given are to be used for God, and not just hoarded.

People: For it will be as when a man going on a journey called his servants and entrusted to them his property; to one he gave five talents, to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability.

Leader: When the master returns, he calls his servants to see how they have used what they were given, and comments those who have traded and doubled their money.

People: Well done, good and faithful servant; for you have been faithful over little, I will set you over much; enter into the joy of your master.

Leader: But when the one who was afraid of losing what he had been given and so hid the talent in a hole in the ground gave it back without even any bank interest, the master took it from him, and said:

People: To everyone who has will more be given, and he will have abundance; but to him who has not, even what he has will be taken away.

Leader: The promise of God is not that each individual has a full supply of all the gifts that there are, but that the members of his Church together have all they need. So by learning to share them, we can build up the body of Christ.

People: There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but the same God works all of them in all people.

Leader: When Isaiah saw a vision of the majesty of God in the Temple, he was struck dumb by his unworthiness. But then he heard the voice of the Lord, saying:

People: Whom shall I send and who will go for us?

Leader: Then he said: People: Here am I! Send me.

Leader: But it is not just that we are to use the gifts God has given us, he also needs us to bring his will into being. We cannot pray and do nothing. When we pray: 'Your kingdom come; your will be done, on earth as in heaven,' we are offering ourselves as agents of God's transforming love.

People: Christ has no body now on earth but ours, no hands but ours, no feet but ours. Ours are the eyes through which Christ's compassion is to look out on the world;

Ours are the feet with which he is to go about doing good; Ours are the hands by which he is to bless his people, Now and to the end of the ages. Amen! (St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582)

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, according to the institution of thy dearly beloved Son our Savior Jesus Christ, we, thy humble servants, do celebrate and make here before thy divine Majesty, with these thy holy gifts, which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; rendering unto thee most hearty thanks for the innumerable benefits procured unto us by the same.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us; and, of thy almighty goodness, vouchsafe

to bless and sanctify, with thy Word \* and Holy Spirit, these thy gifts and creatures of bread and wine; that we, receiving them according to thy Son our Savior Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed \* Body and Blood.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant that, by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we, and all thy whole Church, may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy, and living sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee that we, and all others who shall be partakers of this Holy Communion, may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, be filled with thy grace \*\* and heavenly benediction, and made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him.

And although we are unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service, not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offences, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

By whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honor and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. AMEN.

THE IMAGERY OF PENTECOST: As with the liturgy of the Blessing of the Waters at Epiphany, the proclamation at Pentecost is that all creation is renewed and restored by the life-giving breath of God: "In the Lord's epiphany all creation becomes good again, indeed "very good," the way that God himself made it and proclaimed it to be in the beginning when "the Spirit of God was moving over the face of the waters" (Gen 1:2) and when the "Breath of Life" was breathing in all humanity and in everything that God made (Gen 1:30; 2:7)." On Pentecost the Breath of God on the waters is focused on renewing the People of God: John 20: 21,22: "Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit."" And from today's gospel: "He who believes in me, as the Scripture said, 'From his innermost being will flow rivers of living water." But this He spoke of the Spirit, whom those who believed in Him were to receive."

In the same way that water is pictured as a great outpouring, a flood of goodness, the Breath of God is in image the mighty wind that blew into the room where the disciples were waiting at Jesus' command. The activity of God is imaged also as fire: the light of renewal is a fire, catching the timid disciples up into the glory of God himself. As God appeared to Moses as a burning bush, we become part of that fire, witnessing to his Presence in our time and place.
